Extracts from the July Newsletter:

Mission Statement Over the last few months, considerable work and conversation has been taking place on the Circuit's Mission Statement. A draft was presented at the recent Circuit Meeting where it was approved for use. A hard copy has/will be sent to all churches in the Circuit. Please take the time to read and consider it in the context of your church and its mission.

Circuit Directory The electronic Circuit Directory, held in the Circuit Dropbox, is made available to members on a need to know basis. Historically, there was an annual paper edition, often soon out of date, whereas now data is continually updated as people's and churches details change. It is the responsibility of churches and individuals to pass on any changes to ensure the Directory is always up to date. The intention is to provide each church with a hard copy for its reference. It should however be emphasised that the Directory holds people's private information and so should not be used or made available for general viewing or used for anything other than Church business.

David Rice says farewell to Petersfield Church where he has had pastoral oversight for the last two years. The good news is that David remains in the Circuit as a Supernumerary Minister.

Extract from E-News reporting on the Annual Methodist Conference

What is marriage?

After discussions with thousands of people across the Connexion on marriage and relationships, led by a task group established by the Conference, a resolution was passed to reconsider the Church's definition of marriage.

This does not necessarily mean that there will be a change of definition, but that the Church wishes to re-examine it through a period of theological and scriptural reflection.



The statement on *A Christian Understanding of Family Life, the Single Person and Marriage* from 1992 may also be updated as part of that work, which will be led by a new working party.

The Revd Graham Carter, Chair of the Marriage and Relationships Task Group commented, "It is essential to take time over this issue because the process of finding a way forward is as important as reaching a decision. Enabling people in the church to talk openly about their differing convictions and value their common commitment to Jesus Christ is key to what it means to be a Christian community.

"The decision of the Conference to establish a working party on the matters of marriage and relationships is an important step which comes from a widespread conversation in which people have listened, respected each other's position and engaged in deep reflection together. The conversations will continue and we will go on responding to the challenges of interpreting God's love for today's society."
