Dear friends,

It has been difficult to keep up with the news and current affairs over the last few weeks. The build-up, the result and subsequent fallout from the general election has brought uncertainty. The terrorist attacks in Manchester, central London and at Finsbury Park have brought death and destruction to the streets of our country. The appalling fire at Grenfell Towers has brought harrowing pictures and scenes into our homes. Not to mention that there is much else in the wider world that is also fraught with turmoil and violence.

We live in trying and testing times and we might ask 'Where is God in all of this?' As we see such suffering and grief expressed by so many affected in different places and at different times we have no words that are fitting enough to articulate the horror or the sadness that is so evident and some of us have personal challenges to face too.

However, if we are to try and find comfort and consolation in such circumstances then the words in the book of Psalms might be a good place to start. Not looking for platitudes or niceties that we might be tempted to use at such times but more that we cling on with the Psalmists to what we still believe about God when we, and others, face challenges that are hard to endure. One such example is the heartrending opening to Psalm 22 that cries out 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest'. It can be consoling to discover that in the Bible there is a voice like this, a bewildering voice that wonders where God is in times of great stress and calamity. The Psalmist's opening line is also blurted out by Jesus from the cross. He too cries out in his pain and asks the same question of God. A God who seems absent when God is most needed!

But God *isn't* absent in the face of suffering. God is *right there* amongst it all. One of the messages of the cross is that God knows what it is to suffer and so He reaches out to us in our most anguished moments and, in some cases, He can use desperate situations to reveal His presence and His love.
