Dear Friends,

I joked in church one morning, when I misheard the response of a member of the congregation to a question that I had asked, that "I was going deaf". After being asked for people's favourite football teams, one member responded; "Spurs!" (Tottenham Hotspur) and I heard "Burnley". I do honestly believe that I don't hear as well as I used to, but my wife Jill's repeated requests to have my hearing tested have so far met with a stubborn re-

sponse. That reminded me of a little story I heard recently.....

A man realised he needed to purchase a hearing aid, but he felt unwilling to spend much money. "How much do they cost?" he asked the salesman.

"That depends," said the salesman.
"They run from £2.00 to £2,000."

"Let's see the £2.00 model," he said.



The clerk put the device around the man's neck. "You just stick this button in your ear and run this little string down to your pocket," he instructed.

"How does it work?" the customer asked.

"For £2.00 – it doesn't work," the sales-man replied. "But when people see it on you, they'll talk louder!"

As you know, most communication problems are not due to people talking too softly. Unfortunately, we are not always good listeners. Do you know that people will pay hundreds of pounds an hour for no other reason than to have someone listen to them? Professional counselling and psychology are big busi-

Psychologist Carl Rogers said, "A person's real need, a most terrible need, is for someone to listen...not as a 'patient' but as a human soul." To listen well is to respond to a great human yearning.



Jesus always made time to respond to people's real needs and in the letter of James we are given some salutary advice - **James 1:19-27** ¹⁹My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak".

When it comes to human relationships, there are few greater gifts that you can give to others than your time. We often worry about what we should say to our friends who are in distress – Maybe we shouldn't say much at all – maybe we just need to listen.



Report back on Homelessness in Fareham meeting on Monday 30/4/18

There was a very pleasing attendance of 18 people. Thanks to Holy Trinity Church for hosting!

The meeting started by raising awareness on work that was already taking place.

The following list gives only brief details. A more detailed list will be available linked via the CTiF website.

British Legion/Ex Services

Offers housing and support to ex-services personnel via Emmaus Hampshire, Alabare Home for Veterans, Two Saints and Central Point Day Centre Portsmouth.

Café Imbizo and Suspended Coffee Scheme

Whilst enjoying your drink and food the café allows you to buy an extra drink (or food) under the 'suspended' coffee scheme which is then later served to people in need. A referral is required to access this free food and drink.

Fareham and Gosport Food Banks

Distributes food and other essentials packs which will last a week and up to four times a year. Recipients must be referred from other organisations.

HOME (Helping Others Means Everything)

Distributes hot food and drink and sometimes other needs such as sleeping bags from opposite McDonalds in Fareham at 7pm every night.

Lunch on Sunday

Hot food and drink is served to people alone and in need of company and a warm place. Takes place in Fareham Youth Centre each Sunday.

Open Church Project

Homeless people were invited to sleep inside Portsmouth churches during 4 weeks of this January and February and also given hot food. Each 'guest' had to be referred by the Society of St James (SSJ). Might we replicate this?

Love Mondays at Café Imbizo -

Offers a tasty dinner on a 'pay as you feel basis' and the opportunity to buy 'rescued food'. This is to start again hopefully in June.

Portsmouth Churches Housing Association

Provide a safe homely environment for seven single women and 24 families. There are three hostels in Portsmouth. Before acceptance women must meet certain criteria.

Streetlink App

The StreetLink app enables members of the public to connect people sleeping rough with the local services that can support them. Available on iOS or Android. Unfortunately there is no information as to how effective this service is in the Fareham area.

It is appreciated that several other organisations exist but were not mentioned at the meeting (e.g. Two Saints and Fareham Good Neighbours). The detailed list available via the CTiF website will be extended as more information becomes available.

During the awareness raising there was also much general discussion. This discussion highlighted how complex was the task of helping the homeless. Some members of the group with a great deal of experience in working with the homeless felt that the basic needs of providing hot drinks and food to the homeless was already covered by various organisations. Beyond this it was felt to be extremely difficult for non-professional help to address the other many complex needs.

The same experienced members reported that a very great proportion of the 'homeless' we see have drug and alcohol addiction problems. Additionally some of them may not be homeless at all but are 'begging' in order to fund their addictions.

For the above reasons the group decided we should first concentrate our efforts on trying to find ways of preventing 'those in need' sliding down the spiral of deprivation that can easily lead to homelessness. This is not to say that as time goes by and things develop we would not develop initiatives to help those on the street but that it would not be our first focus.

So what can we do at this very moment in time:

Offer to buy someone on the street hot food and a drink. If this is declined it is suggested NOT to give money. Donate food or other essential items to the various organisations listed above including the Basics Bank. The latest list of desirable items are shown on https://www.facebook.com/FarehamandGosportBasicsBank. Goods can be easily donated using the trolleys at Sainsbury's and Tesco. Enjoy visiting Café Imbizo to eat and drink and use their 'suspended coffee scheme'. Consider using the Streetlink App but do get the 'homeless' person's agreement first!

The time left available to discuss what we could do for 'those in need' was not great but several of the things mentioned were:

Supporting 'people in need' with advocacy

Helping with 'money management skills'

Helping with cooking skills

Helping people with general 'life skills'

It was also suggested that CTiF might set up/support a Community Support Day which amongst other things would make available lots of goods to give away to those in need. The group may also look into setting up a 'mobile hostel' in during particular cold weather such as was done in Portsmouth this January/February under the Open Church scheme.

We agreed to have another meeting in about six to eight weeks. Note – if you wish to make observations or any enquiry about items in this report please contact Paul Tomlinson either by email paul-tomlinson@ntlworld.com or phoning on 01329310379. Fourth Friday Games

After 8 months with attendance at over 20 each time, we are going to take a break in July and August and resume on September 28th.

Bread and Butter Pudding

Ingredients:

Butter for greasing and spreading

8 thick slices of day old white bread (I have used brown bread)

Ground cinnamon

Tbsps mixed fruit to spread over the layers

2x200g glace cherries

5 eggs 1 yolk egg

4tbsp caster sugar (I use golden unrefined sugar)


16floz milk

600ml double cream (pouring)

3/4tsp Vanilla essence

1 1/4 tbsp Demerara Sugar

Marmalade



Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C (350°F Gas Mark 4) brush the dish with some melted butter.
- 2. Spread the bread lightly with butter (Marg) and marmalade and cut each slice in half diagonally.
- 3. Layer the bread in the prepared dish, sprinkling mixed fruit, cherries and cinnamon for the first layer (2 layers in all). Then do the same for the second layer; don't put too many cherries or fruit on as if you do reheat they tend to burn.
- 3. Lightly whisk together the egg, egg yolk and caster sugar in a large bowl.
- 4. Heat the milk and cream until just warm and stir in the vanilla extract.
- 5. Whisk the cream mixture into the egg mixture, strain the custard over the layered bread.
- 6. Leave to stand for 5 minutes.
- 7. Sprinkle with demerara sugar.
- 8. Bake for 30 minutes or until the custard has set and the bread is golden brown.
