Dear friends,

As I write this letter I am in the middle of The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and I'm also trying to hang on to the coat tails of Epiphany before the beginning of February arrives and 40 days after Christmas we move on past Candlemas and into ordinary time before Lent begins in March!

This year the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity's theme was 'Only Justice' taken from a verse in the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy, 'Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue' (Ch.16, verse 11). The service in Fareham to mark the occasion was at Holy Trinity and it focussed on the issue of homelessness in our town. The service itself was a mixture of testimony; congregational hymns; other musical items and prayers. The Singing Group took part in the worship and it was so good to see the church full for the service on a chilly Sunday afternoon! The most moving testimonies were those from folk who had experienced homelessness and eventually, through their own determination and with the support of agencies in Fareham, they had managed to turn their lives around and be reconciled with their families and friends regaining a hope for the future. All of them witnessed to how other people had been willing to come alongside and build relationships with them so enabling them to have the courage and will to encounter change for the better.

We see many injustices in our society of which homelessness is just one example. How might we be moved to work for justice? Who are we called to be alongside in our communities to bring a message of love and hope that will truly make a difference to them? Who else might we work with to bring life in all its fullness to others? These are challenging questions that we ask ourselves as we see the needs in our society today.

As part of Christians Together in Fareham we have a voice and a part to play and our unity with other Christians in our town often means that we can do more together than we can do individually. We may feel that the only thing that we can do is pray! That is just as important too as everything that we seek to do in God's name needs to be supported by the prayers of the people.

We live in challenging times and there are many needs on our doorsteps. May we have the courage and will to show God's love in action in the places where he calls us to be.
