
A Service of Thanksgiving

We have been asked to bring to people's attention the work of "Save a Warrior". There are posters with more information on the notice board in the corridor.



Part Time Employment Opportunity

Fareham Methodist Church Kings Road, Fareham, are looking for someone to work 4 hours a week setting up and clearing away Chairs and Tables for Sunday worship and Monday Mini-Market.

This is a paid position @ £12.60p per hour paid monthly in arrears. Occasional additional hours may also be available setting up for special services during the week, and other small maintenance works.

The person selected needs to be physically fit, as the work involves lifting and moving furniture. They also need to be flexible in their approach and availability, as the working requirement is dependent upon premises use, and individual requirements of the Church and community Groups.

A Criminal Record check (DBS) and references are required. A small amount of training will also need to be completed. We have installed a textile bank alongside the church. The arrangement with Astra Recycling means that the church gets paid 20p per kilogramme for any clothing and textiles put into the bank. We would encourage you all to use it. The money raised will initially be put towards the Eco Project

MAY MESSY CHURCH




Theme for this month was the Noah's Ark story.

I'm just a priest who saw God in the smile of a woman who lost her son... and yet she cooked for others.

That changed me.

So, if you're broken, if you don't believe, if you're tired of the lies. come anyway. With your anger, your doubt, your dirty backpack.

No one here will ask you for a VIP card.

Because this Church, as long as I breathe, will be a home for the homeless, and a rest for the weary.

God doesn't need soldiers. He needs brothers.

And you, yes, you. .. are one of them."
