You can see that it's really me. Touch me and make sure that I am not a ghost, because ghosts don't have bodies, as you see that I do."

Still the disciples weren't sure what to think, so Jesus asked them for something to eat. As He ate some fish, they watched. The disciples realised Jesus had come back to life, and they spent the next month or so with Him. After Jesus returned to heaven, those same disciples went all over the world, teaching about Jesus.

We can let people know about Jesus too by the way we live our lives.
