Matthew 25 v14-30





Make a money bag

You will need: the circle of fabric, the ball of wool, needle and scissors.

		
Thread the needle with wool and stitch through the holes.	Complete the circle, cut the wool and tie the ends together.	On the opposite side of the circle stitch all the way round.
		
Tie the wool together as in the picture.	Pull the 2 knots apart to close the purse.	Here is your finished money bag.

When you have made your money bag you could put your chocolate coins inside it, or perhaps a few pennies to remind you of the gifts that God has given you. It doesn't matter how many gifts you have just try to use them and share them with others.

Make a musical instrument

You will need: the wooden shape, stickers, a pipe cleaner and bells.

First of all decorate the wooden shape with the stickers. Then attach the pipe cleaner to one end by winding it around tightly.

Thread the beads onto the pipe cleaner, the smaller ones (if you have some) will probably need attaching to the pipe cleaner with thread if you want to use them.

Next wind the pipe cleaner onto the other side of the wooden shape and you will then have a bell shaker, like the one in the picture below.



Recipe for Chocolate crunchy cakes

This month we have chosen a recipe that the children can make once an adult has melted the chocolate.

You will need: approximately 200g of chocolate, cup cases, Rice Krispies and or cornflakes.

Lay out about 20 cup cases on a tray.

Place the chocolate in a bowl and either melt it in the microwave or over a saucepan of boiling water. Then add some rice Krispies and or some cornflakes until the chocolate is absorbed. Next, place spoonfuls of the mixture into the cup cases and leave to set.

Once set you can share the crunchy cakes and enjoy eating them!
